The health and life study of Afghan Immigrants

“Iqbal” (اقبال), a Dari word meaning “fortune”, symbolizes hope and future well-being for Afghan immigrants.

With limited research on health and life status of Afghan immigrants, Iqbal Survey aims to bridge this gap and inform efforts to support this population in California.



Survey Team

Researchers from the University of California, San Francisco (UCSF), led by Dr. Ali Mirzazadeh, Associate Professor, are conducting the survey.



Survey Interview

The survey includes two interviews: one at the start and another six months later, by phone or in person, based on your preference.



Invitation to Participate

Participants will be encouraged to refer friends via text, WhatsApp, or email, helping us reach more Afghan immigrants interested in the study.



Compensation

If participate in all surveys, participants will receive up to \$150 for their time and effort, along with a chance to win \$100 in a prize drawing.
